*Beyond Belief* tells the inspiring story of Susan Retik and Patti Quigley, two women widowed on 9/11 who channeled their grief into helping widows and their communities in Afghanistan. Susan and Patti's story challenges viewers to re-examine stereotypes about the Muslim world and encourages discussion about issues of war, religion, gender, human rights, cross-cultural understanding and America's role in the world to create a more peaceful global community.

The workshop aims to inspire young people to address the difficult issues of our time, while providing practical ideas for creating change in their communities.

This two and a half hour program will include a portion of the award-winning documentary *Beyond Belief* followed by a focused discussion with filmmaker Sean Flynn (Principle Pictures), Laura Kavanaugh of Americans for Informed Democracy, and a reflection by Mr. Derreck Kayango of CARE. Participants will explore the complex issues surrounding the “war on terror”, discuss ways to promote peace through non-violent global engagement, and will receive tools in the form of education and action-guides for students to take the next step.
